The Flu in Australia, 2019

In 2019, Australia's health system has had to face one of the worst flu seasons on record. The number of reported flu cases for 2019 has climbed over 300,000 at the time of writing, which is 80 per cent higher than 2018 and 17 per cent higher than 2017 – described by experts as the 'worst ever'.

Sadly, this year at least 812¹ people have died from the flu – an increase from 64 people in 2018 and up from at least 804 in 2018 – whilst almost 4,000 people have been hospitalised.²

New South Wales was one of the States hit hardest, with 37 per cent of Australia's reported flu cases and over 300 deaths coming from the State alone, compared to Queensland and Victoria (21 per cent each) and South Australia (8.5 per cent). Western Australia – despite avoiding much of the 2017 flu crisis – faced its worst flu season on record, with flu cases nearly four times higher this year when compared to 2018.

How Pharmacists have helped

As Australia's most easily accessible health professional in the community, pharmacists play a growing role in minimising the spread of influenza. Last year, more than a million Australians chose to receive their flu shot from a community pharmacy, doubling this year to two million.⁸

2019 was just the third year every State and Territory in Australia allowed pharmacists to vaccinate against the flu. Most recently, Victoria lowered the age of flu vaccines to 10 to relieve pressure off GPs⁹ – putting the State in line

with Western Australia and Tasmania. Research shows that pharmacists are as trusted as GPs by the Australian public¹⁰ explaining their willingness to see them for straight-forward issues like the flu shot.

In Australia, increasing vaccine access has ultimately meant that more families have been protected from the virus, whilst relieving GP clinics to focus on more complex conditions and procedures. Freeing up GP appointments which would otherwise have been spent administering flu shots means GPs can spend more time with their patients and treat more serious or complicated issues.

National Immunisation Program (NIP)

If you belong to any of the 'at risk' categories (below)¹¹, you are eligible to receive a free flu shot each year from a GP, but not in a community pharmacy in most States. Victoria offers the program in community pharmacies for patients who are over 16. The ACT is currently trialling the NIP in pharmacies for those aged 65 years and older¹².
